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**NOTICE REGARDING RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
SERVICES COMMITMENTS FOR NOFA 24-A**

In an effort to coordinate and maximize the utilization of federal rental assistance resources throughout the County of Los Angeles, project sponsors are advised to apply for rental assistance through the local Housing Authority serving their proposed project. Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool (FHSP) commitments are currently not being issued by the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services (DHS), and by mutual agreement, FHSP will not be an accepted rental subsidy under Notice of Funding Availability Round 24-A (NOFA 24-A).

Projects that are located in jurisdictions served by the Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles should apply for project-based rental assistance through NOFA 24-A. The Community Development Commission/Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles (CDC/HACoLA) is aware that some projects may not secure an alternative rental subsidy in time for the NOFA 24-A deadline. Therefore, for projects located in jurisdictions where the local Housing Authority has not yet issued a NOFA or RFP for project-based rental assistance, or where the local Housing Authority's award decision will not meet the NOFA 24-A application deadline, project sponsors should include in the NOFA 24-A application a narrative describing the expected timeframe for application and award. CDC/HACoLA will then defer the need for evidence of the project's rental assistance commitment until January 2019. These projects should include the proposed rental assistance assumptions in the NOFA 24-A application, as if committed.

Please note that DHS commitments for Intensive Case Management Services (ICMS) will continue to be made available for all units serving individuals and families experiencing homelessness. A letter from DHS regarding supportive service delivery will not be required to fulfill any requirements in NOFA 24-A. ICMS will be linked to the project upon securing all funding and entitlements.
