LUGO PARK RENOVATIONS COMPLETED IN THE CITY OF CUDAHY

County Invests \$1 Million in New Soccer Field and Renovated Public Restrooms

Cudahy, June 29, 2016 – The Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles (CDC) joined Congresswoman Roybal-Allard, First District Supervisor Hilda



L. Solis, officials from the City of Cudahy and community members to celebrate the grand opening of the Lugo Park Soccer Field and Restroom Renovation Project. The project was made possible through

the investment of over \$1 million in federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, used to leverage an additional \$700,000.

The Lugo Park Soccer Field consists of 45,000 square feet of synthetic grass which includes a regulation-sized soccer field in accordance with the International Federation of Association Football (FIFA) standards. An estimated 300-500



participants will be served through the soccer program. The field is also compatible with other outdoor uses for the public to enjoy. Additionally, the park's outdoor men's and women's public restrooms were renovated with new paint with graffiti resistant coating, new urinals and partitions, and Americans with Disabilities Act upgrades to the sinks, toilets, and plumbing.



Sean Rogan, Executive Director of the CDC, the agency that administers CDBG funding on behalf of the County, said, "The addition of the new field provides youth with a superior playing area designed to meet their recreational needs. The County is

proud to invest its CDBG dollars to improve the park for all Cudahy residents to enjoy!"
